VCAPCD joins trial ship speed reduction program

n September 9, the Ventura County Air Pollution Control District Board approved the APCD's participation in a coalition of four government and nonprofit groups in their trial incentive program underway in the Santa Barbara Channel since July 1st to slow down cargo ships to reduce air pollution and help protect endangered whales.

The coalition includes the Environmental Defense Center (EDC), the National Marine Sanctuary Foundation, the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration's (NOAA) Channel Islands National Marine Sanctuary, and the Santa Barbara County APCD. The EDC is a non-profit law firm that protects and enhances the local environment through education, advocacy, and legal action and works primarily within Santa Barbara, Ventura, and San Luis Obispo counties. The National Marine Sanctuary Foundation enhances all national marine sanctuaries in their goal to protect essential U.S. marine areas and to ensure a healthy ocean. NOAA's Channel Islands National Marine Sanctuary was designated in 1980 to protect marine resources surrounding San Miguel, Santa Rosa, Santa Cruz, Anacapa and Santa Barbara islands. The sanctuary spans approximately 1,470 square miles, extending from island shorelines to six miles offshore, and encompasses a rich diversity of marine life, habitats and historical and cultural resources. And the Santa Barbara County APCD is the local air quality agency for that county.

At the meeting, the APCD Board approved \$30,000 in funding for the incentive program

effort. With the Ventura County APCD's contribution, a total of 32 transits will be incentivized with the program's total current funding of \$90,000. Large marine cargo ships transiting the Santa Barbara Channel (approximately 2,500 per year), as well as those docking at Port Hueneme, are a significant source of air pollution in Santa Barbara and Ventura Counties. Air emissions from ocean going vessels transiting the Santa Barbara Channel constitute approximately one quarter of the ozone-forming nitrogen oxide emissions in VCAPCD's jurisdiction. Channel ship traffic is also a significant source of other air pollutants such as sulfur dioxide, greenhouse gases, diesel particulate matter, and other toxic air pollutants.

According to Air Pollution Control Officer Mike Villegas, "By having these ships slow down in the Channel, we will be achieving significant emission reductions and helping to protect public health." *(Continued on Page 3.)*

The program has been modeled after the successful vessel speed reduction programs at the ports of Los Angeles and Long Beach where over 90 percent of the shipping lines participate. Research conducted to determine the benefits of those programs indicates that reducing vessel speeds from normal cruise speeds of over 14 knots down to 12 knots or less can reduce emissions of nitrogen oxides and carbon dioxide by about 50 percent and 60 percent respectively. The slower speed also greatly reduces the chances that ships will strike whales and that a ship strike on a whale will kill the whale.

Six global shipping companies, COSCO, Hapag Lloyd, K Line, Maersk Line, Matson, and United Arab Shipping Company are participating in the program and have identified ships in their fleets that will transit between Point Conception and the Ports of Los Angeles and Long Beach, from July-October 31, 2014, at speeds of 12 knots or less (reduced from typical speeds of 14 – 18 knots). Participating companies will receive \$2,500 per verified transit through the Santa Barbara Channel.

Santa Barbara County Air Pollution Control District Air Pollution Control Officer Dave Van Mullem remarked, "We are thrilled that the Ventura County Air Pollution Control District is helping to fund the program. The increased funding will help reduce more emissions of smog-forming pollutants that harm our health, and will allow us to gather more data in our trial program.".

Santa Barbara County Air Pollution Control District and the Santa Barbara Foundation are also contributing funding, and the National Marine Sanctuary Foundation will manage the incentive payments. Payments will be provided upon verification of the ships' speeds through the Channel, using Automatic Identification System monitors that receive speed and location data from transponders on the ships.

"The expansion of the program will provide more data for the development of science-based solutions to both the air quality and whale protection issues," said TL Garrett, vice president, Pacific Merchant Shipping Association. "Our members are pleased to participate in this voluntary program to advance the science."

Maersk Line representative Dr. Lee Kindberg, director, Environment & Sustainability, North America, added, "This is exciting news. More transits during the trial period will give us more data, and a better handle on creating a successful program."

Kristi Birney of the Environmental Defense Center said, "This program offers real benefits on climate issues, endangered species protection, and human health for our entire region. It is wonderful to have both Ventura and Santa Barbara County air districts doing so much for this partnership to slow ships down in the Santa Barbara Channel, improving the air we breathe and protecting the whales we all enjoy spotting off our coast."

Informing the public

On Sepember 10, the coalition presented a public meeting, *Protecting Blue Whales and Blue Skies*, in Santa Barbara (see photo on this page). Over 90 people attended to listen to speakers on air quality, marine biology, and current research in offshore emissions, as they all relate to the incentive program.

Board highlights. At its **September 9** meeting, the **APCD Board** took the following actions:


 ✓ Approved a Memorandum of Understanding with the National Marine Sanctuary Foundation (NMSF) for a marine vessel speed reduction incentive trial program in the Santa Barbara Channel. (see feature article)

✓ Approved 45 grant funding requests totaling \$2,773,279 for new air quality projecyt under the **Carl Moyer Memorial Air Quality Standards Attainment Program**.

The projects have a total projected emission reduction of 35.7 tons per year of ozone precursors, 1.7 tons per year of diesel particulate matter, and 318 metric tonnes of carbon dioxide, a greenhouse gas, per year. 




Ozone Report





